# SUMMARY OF QUALIFICATIONS

As a Senior Analyst at the Center for Strategic and Budgetary Assessments, Mr. Walton focuses his research and analysis on the development of new operational concepts and trends in future warfare and Asia-Pacific security dynamics. Mr. Walton has authored a number of publications on Chinese military doctrine and capabilities, regional security dynamics, and U.S. force planning. He frequently contributes to print and broadcast media, is a regular participant in regional conferences, and has served as a guest lecturer at Georgetown University.

## **CURRENT POSITION**

Mr. Walton is a senior analyst at CSBA, an independent policy research institute established to promote innovative thinking about defense planning and investment strategies for the 21st century.

## PREVIOUS PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

As an Associate of Delex Systems, Mr. Walton supported the work of several U.S. Navy offices in developing roadmaps for unmanned, electromagnetic, and directed energy weapon systems; analyzing Asia-Pacific security dynamics; and assessing U.S. CONOPS. He also served as task leader and lead author for U.S. Army studies analyzing the alignment of the Air Defense Artillery branch CONOPS and force structure with emerging CONOPS and operational demands. He also designed, facilitated, and participated in wargames for a variety of Department of Defense clients.

As a principal of Alios Consulting Group, Mr. Walton facilitated the capture shaping of a diverse range of U.S., Japanese, and Indian Tier I and II commercial and defense companies through client representation, market studies, market entry strategies, strategic partnership consulting, and acquisition due diligence. He also supported prominent Washington, DC think tanks in analyzing Asia-Pacific security dynamics, developing actionable recommendations, and writing reports.

Earlier internships in Mr. Walton's career include work at the Center for Strategic and International Security's Defense-Industrial Initiatives Group, where he quantitatively analyzed DoD Major Defense Acquisition Programs, researched and authored reports on foreign military sales, commercial off-the-shelf government acquisitions, Saudi Arabia's naval modernization, and trends in global unmanned aircraft systems and air-to-air missile markets. In an internship for the Federation of American Scientists' Nuclear Information Project, he researched and analyzed Chinese nuclear weapon strategy, especially the Aviation Industry Corporation of China (AVIC)-II/Shenyang Aircraft Corporation (SAC) H-6K/M bomber industrial base production efforts, basing strategy, and force laydown; Chinese nuclear-powered attack submarine refit efforts; and the Chinese Nuclear Command and Control System. Other internships include aiding a U.S. lawyer with cases involving Latin America, the Helms-Burton Act, and U.S. Department of Treasury electronic funds transfer regulations and guidance, as well as conducting constituent work for a U.S. Congressman.
