Washington, D.C., January 27, 2021 – The Center for Strategic and Budgetary Assessments (CSBA), the world's premier center for understanding future international competition and conflict, is proud to announce its inaugural fellows for the CSBA Defense Journalism Seminar Series. Jack Detsch is a Pentagon and national security correspondent at Foreign Policy magazine, where he works to provide readers with a front-row seat to the Defense Department debates shaping U.S. national security. In his


current role, he has broken numerous stories that lawmakers have drawn on to press the Trump administration for accountability on topics such as arms control and Chinese foreign investment. In 2019, while serving as a reporter at Al-Monitor, a global news organization covering the Middle East, Detsch won the exemplary media award from the Forum on the Arms Trade for his coverage of the Trump administration's policy toward Yemen, after his reporting revealed that the U.S. did not plan to provide Congress with a certification allowing American involvement in Yemen, and that the Pentagon had neglected deadlines to provide lawmakers with a U.S. strategy for the conflict. Detsch came to Washington after covering cybersecurity for the Christian Science Monitor and working at NPR-affiliated radio stations in the San Francisco Bay Area.

Lee Hudson is Pentagon editor for the Aviation Week Network, covering policy, strategy and acquisition at the Defense Department and in the halls of Congress. Prior to joining Aviation Week in 2018, Lee was at Inside Defense where she was chief editor for Inside the Navy. She has covered Navy and Marine Corps issues since 2011, reporting at the Pentagon, Capitol Hill, aboard warships and military facilities around the globe.
