Dr. Lalwani's research interests include nuclear deterrence, interstate rivalry, alliances, crisis behavior, counter/insurgency, and Indo-Pacific security. Previously, he was a Senior Fellow for Asia Strategy and the Director of the South Asia Program at the Henry L. Stimson Center. He has also been an Adjunct Professor at GWU's Elliott School of International Affairs and a Stanton Nuclear Security Postdoctoral Fellow at the RAND Corporation. He is the editor of *Investigating Crises: South Asia's Lessons, Evolving Dynamics, and Trajectories* (Stimson Center, 2018). His research has also been published in *Security Studies, International Studies Quarterly*, the *Journal of Strategic Studies , Small Wars & Insurgencies, Survival, The Washington Quarterly, Asian Survey, Foreign Affairs*, and the *New York Times*. Lalwani completed his Ph.D. from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology' Department of Political Science and was an affiliate of the MIT Security Studies Program.
