Doyle Hodges is a scholar of national security and defense, who from 2019-2023 was Executive Editor of the Texas National Security Review (TNSR). From 1992-2013, he served as a naval officer, commanding a salvage ship forward deployed to Sasebo, Japan and the USS Ross (DDG 71), a destroyer homeported in Norfolk, Virginia. His analysis has appeared in Lawfare, War on the Rocks, TNSR, and The Washington Post. He currently teaches at Princeton University and George Mason University and previously taught at the U.S. Naval Academy and the U.S. Naval War College. He holds a doctorate in international security studies from Princeton University, masters degrees from Princeton, the U.S. Naval War College, and the University of Maryland, College Park, and an undergraduate degree from the U.S. Naval Academy.
