As a Research Fellow at the Center for Strategic and Budgetary Assessments, Mr. Walton focuses his research and analysis on the development of new operational concepts and the assessment of trends in future warfare and Asia-Pacific security dynamics. He has authored numerous reports, articles, and book chapters on a wide range of topics, ranging from U.S. force planning to Chinese information warfare. He frequently contributes to print and broadcast media, is a regular participant in regional conferences, and has served as a guest lecturer at Georgetown University and The Catholic University of America.

Mr. Walton is a Research Fellow at CSBA, an independent policy research institute established to promote innovative thinking about defense planning and investment strategies for the 21st century.

PREVIOUS PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

As an Associate of Delex Systems, Mr. Walton supported the work of several U.S. Navy offices in developing roadmaps for unmanned, electromagnetic, and directed energy weapon systems; analyzing Asia-Pacific security dynamics; and assessing U.S. concepts of operation. He also served as task leader and lead author for U.S. Army studies analyzing the alignment of Air Defense Artillery and Field Artillery branch concepts and force structure with emerging concepts and operational demands.
